

Route

- 1 Leave «Jardin de la Lamproie» towards Sainte-Terre.
- 2 River along Dordogne river up to the village.
- 3 At the crossroads, turn right towards the village.
- 4 In the village, pass in front of the church and continue straight on.
- 5 Before leaving the village, take slightly on your right the street «rue du Parlement» (sign circuit des condamines).
- 6 Reach the river, ride along and cross the hamlet.
- 7 After the hamlet, leave the river and follow the road that takes a left turn.
- 8 At the junction, turn right.
- 9 Continue straight on.
- 10 Pass the sign "Le Grand Cauley" and enter the village Saint Magne-de-Castillon.
- 11 At the «give way» sign in front of the stadium, turn right.
- 12 At the stop, turn right towards Rauzan.
- 13 Cross the bridge above Dordogne river using the sidewalk.
- 14 After the bridge, turn right towards Rauzan.
- 15 Continue straight on along Dordogne river.
- 16 In Civrac, continue straight on.
- 17 Go straight on towards Saint-Jean-de-Blaignac.
- 18 Pass in front of Château Courtebotte and go up the hill towards the village.
- 19 In the village, go down on your right in «rue du Pont » up to the river.
- 20 At the bottom of «rue du Pont», cross the bridge on your right.
- 21 You enter Lavagnac. Reach «Jardin de la Lamproie». You are arrived.

Dordogne river

Dordogne river forms in Puy-de-Dôme, on the flanks of Puy de Sancy (1 885 m), by the meeting of two torrents, named Dore and Dogne, in the village of Mont-Dore.

The river crosses 6 counties : Puy-de-Dôme, Cantal, Corrèze, Lot, Dordogne, Gironde.

At bec d'Ambès, it flows with Garonne river into Gironde estuary. 483 km-lon, Dordogne river is navigable downstream Libourne. The tide is felt up to Castillon-la-Bataille and a tidal bore can be observed in St-Pardon-de-Vayres.

Dordogne valley is listed as a «Pays d'Art et d'Histoire» in Lot county. Since 2012, the watershed of Dordogne river is listed as a biosphere reserve by UNESCO.

This loop of **18 km** along Dordogne river, from Sainte Terre and passing in Castillon-la-Bataille, is relatively flat. It is designed for riders of all ages who love nature and landscapes . It offers many panoramas over the river.
